OSHA Hazard Communication Standard 29 CFR 1910.1200

Multi-Plastics SDS Compliance Statement

Dear Valued Customer,

All products sold by Multi-Plastics, Inc. are considered "articles" by the definition of the OSHA Communication Standard 29 CFR 1910.1200. The standard defines an article as a manufactured item other than a fluid or particle: (i) which is formed to a specific shape or design during manufacture; (ii) which has an end use function(s) dependant in whole or in part upon its shape or design during end use; and (iii) which under normal conditions of use does not release more than a very small quantity, *e.g.*, minute or trace amounts of a hazardous chemical, and does not pose a physical hazard or health risk to employees. All of Multi-Plastics products meet this definition, are not considered "hazardous chemicals" and therefore no SDS is required by law.
